




HIV IN MARYLAND, 2013

New HIV Diagnoses


- There were **1,395** adult/adolescent HIV cases (age 13+) diagnosed in Maryland in 2013. Baltimore City and Prince George's County had the highest rates of new HIV diagnoses.
- Proportion of HIV diagnoses in Maryland has **decreased** in men from **85.2% in 1985** to **71.0% in 2013**, and has **increased** in women from **14.8% in 1985** to **29.0% in 2013**.



Characteristics of Marylanders Living with HIV

Exposure Category

- **33.9% MSM**
- 27.4% IDU
- **34.9% HET**
- 3.4% MSM/IDU
- 0.4% Other




Race/Ethnicity

- **75.9% NH Black**
- 15.0% NH White
- 4.9% Hispanic
- 4.2% Other

Case rates (per 100,000) were **twice** as high in **males (825.5)** as compared to **females (412.2)**, or **1 in 121 males** and **1 in 242 females** were living with HIV in Maryland.


Maryland Adult/Adolescent HIV Diagnoses, Rates by Jurisdiction, 2013



- Of the **1,395** HIV diagnoses (age 13+) in 2013, **29.7%** were among adults ages **20-29**, **23.2%** among those ages **30-39**, and **21.5%** were among those ages **40-49**.
- **74.6%** of the **1,395** reported HIV diagnoses (age 13+) in Maryland in 2013 were **non-Hispanic (NH) black**, **15.1% NH white**, **5.5% Hispanic**, and **4.7% other races**.



Living Case Rates by Race/Ethnicity



- Total living HIV case rates in Maryland were **4 to 10 times higher** among blacks (**1,610.0**) compared to Hispanics (**368.7**) and NH whites (**165.9**).

At the end of 2013, there were 30,306 living adults/adolescents diagnosed with HIV in Maryland.
