





Fact Sheet – HIV/AIDS and Pediatrics (<13 Years of Age) in Maryland, 2013


- Of the 1,396 reported HIV diagnoses during 2013 in Maryland, 1 (0.1%) was among pediatric cases (<13 years of age).

- The number of reported pediatric HIV cases (by year of birth) peaked in 1990 with 61 cases and decreased to 1 pediatric HIV case (with or without AIDS) born in 2013 (reported as of 12/31/2014).




- There were no pediatric cases reported among the 956 AIDS diagnoses during 2013 in Maryland.
- Of the 30,759 total living HIV cases (with or without AIDS) during 2013 in Maryland, 453 (1.5%) were <13 years old at the time of HIV diagnosis (and alive on 12/31/2013, reported through 12/31/2014). Of these, 54.3% were female, 45.7% were male, 88.1% were non-Hispanic, black 8.6% were non-Hispanic white, 2.0% were Hispanic, and 2.9% were another race.

- Of the 30,759 total living HIV cases (with or without AIDS) in 2013 (reported as of 12/31/2014), 72 (0.2%) were <13 years old, as of 12/31/2013. The rate of pediatric HIV in 2013 was 7.5 cases per 100,000 children <13 years old. Or in other words, 1 in every 13,406 children <13 years old in Maryland was reported to be living with HIV in 2013.
