COURSE DESCRIPTION & OVERALL GOAL

The purpose of this training is to provide clinicians with the basic skills and information on the diagnosis and treatment of TB as well as public health and case management issues related to TB control. This training utilizes lectures, discussions, case studies, interactive exercises, video, and question and answer sessions.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This training is designed for nurses, physicians, and other healthcare professionals who have at least six months of experience working with TB and wish to gain a greater understanding of TB basics. In addition, outreach workers may attend Day 1 of this training is also for outreach workers.

WHY COURSE IS NEEDED

As the incidence of tuberculosis continues to decline, maintaining clinical and public health expertise in TB is particularly challenging. This training aims to build the TB knowledge base of clinical and public health staff in order to facilitate prompt identification, adequate treatment, and proper case management of latent TB infection and TB disease.

OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to:

- Utilize the national and local epidemiology of tuberculosis in order to target and treat individuals at risk for TB.
- Apply current recommendations for diagnosing and treating latent TB infection and TB disease.
- Develop individualized case management strategies to promote adherence to medical and nursing recommendations in TB patients.
- Apply contact investigation principles in assessing potential TB exposure and transmission in the community.
- Identify appropriate infection control measures along the continuum of care, including inpatient and discharge planning to prevent transmission of TB.
