Please describe any recommendations made by your team for local action.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Every baby born in Anne Arundel County should have a safe crib (or safe crib-like item) and all parents will know and practice safe sleeping methods.</li><li>• School counselors and nursing staff should continue to work with teens to encourage prenatal care and use of Safe Havens if the teen does not want to raise the baby.</li><li>• Parents should be reminded to reduce or eliminate access to deadly items (like weapons or medicines). Medicine cabinets should be cleaned out regularly and expired or no longer needed items be disposed.</li><li>• Instruct lifeguards to initiate CPR for drowning victims immediately, not stop to put on gloves.</li><li>• Encourage pool operators (especially busy pools) to establish a “swimmers only” policy for adult pools. Non-swimmers should generally be restricted to wading pools. Non-swimmers could have pool opportunities when child:adult ratios are small. In general swim aids (arm floats, inner tubes, swim vests) should not be used in adult pools because they create reliance on flotation devices (that can be used improperly and can slip off) and give children a false sense of security.</li><li>• Encourage parents to closely observe children when they are in pools.</li></ul>

Please describe any actions taken by your jurisdiction that stem from your CFR activities. <i>Briefly highlight any special activities.</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A Healthy Babies Summit was held and Healthy Babies Coalition was formed. The Coalition is developing a workplan.</li><li>• DSS expanded their Safe Haven initiative.</li><li>• DSS is showing a safe-sleeping video in waiting areas.</li><li>• Stork’s Nest program and classes were developed by the Department of Health and Baltimore-Washington Medical Center and held at the BWMC Arundel Mills storefront.</li><li>• Resources were added to the Local Management Board’s Network of Care website (<a href="http://www.networkofcare.org">www.networkofcare.org</a>).</li><li>• The Department of Health will develop an education document for lifeguards to stress the need for immediate CPR for drowning victims. It will stress when it is <u>not</u> appropriate to take time to put on gloves.</li><li>• Students (siblings or close friends of cases) received monitoring and counseling at their public schools.</li></ul>
