**Part E: Your Ideas and Input:**

1. Please describe any recommendations made by your team for local action.

- Every baby born in Anne Arundel County should have a safe crib (or safe crib-like item) and all parents will know and practice safe sleeping methods.
- Add an educational message and agreement provision to crib distribution program: Baby’s crib is for baby only! Do not store anything in baby’s crib.
- Consider parental safe sleeping and no shaking pledges at hospitals for all newborns.
- Encourage parents to always lock doors and gates to backyard pools and closely observe children when they are in pools.
- Look for opportunities to collaborate with county permit office home pool installation and pool cleaning and insurance companies to promote home pool safety to residents.
- Continue to support community mental health education programs for parents and teens.
- Explore additional data analysis from police reports related to suicide attempts.
- Explore additional data collection on suicide attempts from local emergency departments.
- Explore adding a “texting” capability to a suicide hotline as another avenue for outreach and Followup.
- Faith-based counseling programs may provide additional direct services and parenting/community education about youth suicide prevention.
- Recreation and Parks coaches would benefit from youth violence prevention education. The parenting center at AACC may be a resource.
- Parenting education should be available on-line at no or low cost.
- PTAs may be able to organize parents to attend parenting training.

2. Please describe any actions taken by your jurisdiction that stem from your CFR activities.  
*Briefly highlight any special activities.*

- The Department of Health developed a local crib distribution program with the Annapolis Family Support Center and DOH Healthy Start program and included an educational message and agreement: Baby’s crib is for baby only! Do not store anything in baby’s crib.

- Healthy Babies health education materials were distributed county-wide through health care provider offices, hospitals, faith-based organizations and social service organizations. For Calendar Year 2010 (Jan- Dec 2010) - over 46,000 English and Spanish healthy babies brochures were distributed to new parents, daycare providers, provider offices, hospitals and other health organizations.
- The Department of Health has a website ([www.aahealthybabies.org](http://www.aahealthybabies.org)) and a “taking care of baby” module was developed and placed on the website to promote safe sleep and avoidance of shaken baby syndrome. Since July 2010, there have been over 5,400 hits to the Healthy Babies web pages. In September/October 2010, a Safe Sleep Media Campaign ran for two months in the Maryland Gazette and Pennysaver.
- Nurses from the Department of Health provided parent education at various health fairs on SIDS, SUDI and safe sleeping.
- Students (siblings or close friends of infant/child death cases) received monitoring and counseling at their public schools.
- The Department of Health and the Healthy Babies Coalition held two half-day Safe Babies conference for child care caregivers and other community leaders on Good Parenting and Home Safety/Injury Prevention.
- Injury Prevention education materials were added to the Department of Health website including *Swimming Pools Checklist for Safety* developed by the Anne Arundel County Office of Fire Safety and Injury Prevention Education
- The Department of Health epidemiologist developed a suicide data report including data on attempts. The report, “Adolescent Suicide Report: An Assessment of Adolescent Suicide Behavior in Anne Arundel County,” was released to the public by the Anne Arundel County Department of Health in September 2010 to increase awareness of the issue and to assist the local Youth Suicide Awareness (YSA) group in their efforts to prevent suicide in adolescents.

1. Please describe any recommendations made by your team for local action.

- Increase awareness about the dangers of administering over the counter medications to infants less than 6 months old during Flu season.
- Promote bike safety in May. Provide incentive prizes to reward citizens for observing safety practices.
- Empower men to participate in the reproductive health decisions made in the family by increasing the male reproductive health education given to men.
- Provide safe sleep education to dads in addition to moms. The Team has documented a number of babies who die in an unsafe sleep environment while in the care of their father.
- Continue to educate providers on the need to complete and return Prenatal Risk Assessments.
- B'more for Health Babies Communications Campaign:
  - Educate the public on the maximum amount of time a baby should sleep before waking to be feed or changed. Perhaps the communications team can add the teaching point to the B'more for Healthy Babies web site.
  - Outreach and educate all providers, including private providers about safe sleep practices.
- B'more for Healthy Babies Steering Committee:
  - Work to standardize discharge policies at all birthing hospitals to improve birth outcomes by linking women and their families with appropriate community resources and information.

All birthing hospitals have committed to showing the safe sleep video to families prior to postpartum discharge.</li> <li>● The Office of the Mayor is tracking indicators related to infant sleep practices on a monthly basis.</li> <li>● The B'more for Healthy Babies website has been created. The website address is <a href="http://www.healthybabiesbaltimore.com">www.healthybabiesbaltimore.com</a>. The website addresses issues that affect pregnancy outcomes such as safe sleep, prenatal care, etc.</li> <li>● A Safe sleep outreach and education campaign is underway in the City.</li> <li>● A database is under development that maps out all providers in the City who could potentially benefit from safe sleep training.
