**PURPOSE:** Public Health practitioners and other concerned groups are interested in raising awareness of the magnitude of injury problems and reducing the injury burden in communities throughout Maryland. To that end, the Center for Health Promotion and Education (CHP) will provide up to **\$4,000** to local health departments for small scale injury prevention programs (either new or continuation of a program currently funded by CHP). Four priority areas reflecting the leading injury indicators for Maryland and the National Center for Injury Prevention and Control (CDC) were identified for 2011: **fall prevention for older adults** (use Part-C), **fire safety, poison prevention and child maltreatment prevention**. Consideration will also be given to other injury prevention initiatives based local data/priorities. Deliverables include a final activity report submitted electronically, completion of Event Encounter Forms, and a presentation at the fall 2011 Injury Prevention Coordinators Meeting.
