

Behavioral Health Data Introduction:

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene's Deputy Secretariat of Behavioral Health and Disabilities is responsible for three areas of behavioral health and disabilities for the State of Maryland: Mental Hygiene, Alcohol and Drug Abuse, and Developmental Disabilities. Data presented in this section include unique FQHC/inpatient consumer counts, behavioral health disorder prevalence, and estimated need for alcohol and drug abuse treatment.

Behavioral Health Data Tables:

Unique FQHC/Inpatient Consumer Data

Please note that these Claims Data are based off of claims paid through 08/31/2009. Also, providers have up to 12 months to submit a claim for service; therefore, there is a claim lag in the data.
